MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT – David Sherry

<u>Upcoming Work on Sand Dune Preservation – OILA's #2 priority from our survey:</u>

Get ready. Early in 2021 we will be asking for volunteers to help plant sea oats on Okaloosa Island's sand dunes. Okaloosa County will provide permitting, scheduling, procurement, roughly \$60,000 in TDC funds and a matching state grant for more funding. OILA and the Condo Alliance of Okaloosa Island are working in cooperation with the County to arrange volunteers and help plant the new sea oats.



As you may recall, preserving our dunes was the 2nd highest priority chosen by OILA members in our recent survey. Sea oats thrive in the dune environment, trap blowing sand to grow the dunes, and provide a strong root system to strengthen the dunes.

Brooks Bridge Replacement: The latest on the Brooks Bridge replacement follows. Right of way acquisition is underway. An issue with Air Force property acquisition delayed the schedule and required a modification to the southeast corner of US 98 and Santa Rosa Blvd. The Request for Proposal (RFP) process to get a contractor and engineer on-board is ongoing, and FDOT will advertise that work for the project this summer. The estimated construction start date is November 1, 2022 with construction lasting 3-1/2 to 4 years (completion in the Fall of 2026).

OILA's Architectural Committee (ARC): The reconstituted ARC held its first meeting on December 17 and approved Okaloosa County's project for improvements at the convention center. The virtual meeting ran smoothly over Zoom with documents provided electronically in advance. Although the pandemic caused the move to virtual ARC meetings, the Zoom format offers convenience for both applicants and ARC members. Going forward, the vast majority of ARC meetings will be by Zoom with exceptions for in-person or hybrid meetings by appointment if, for example, the project is too complex or the applicant can't use our Zoom link. If you are interested in serving on the ARC, please contact David Sherry at the email or telephone number listed on page 3 of this edition of the OIL Lantern.

Bridge-to-Bridge Bike Path: The Eglin AFB "Finding of No Significant Impact" report for the bike path has been drafted by staff and is awaiting signature. The plans call for a 12-foot wide path on the south side of US Hwy 98 stretching 4.3 miles from Pier road (East of the Brooks Bridge, between Gulfarium and The Boardwalk) to the Marler Bridge just west of Destin. Reported funding is \$4 million from the TDC and a \$100,000 private donation.



DRAFT MINUTES - OKALOOSA ISLAND LEASEHOLDERS ASSOCIATION - DEC 14, 2020

CALL TO ORDER: Meeting called to order at 7:01 PM by President David Sherry via Zoom due to Covid-19.

- I. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Pledge of Allegiance led by President David Sherry.
- II. ROLL: Board Members Present: David Sherry (President), Rick Deckert (Vice President), John Donovan (Secretary), Brick Bradford, Ed Henderson, Jesse Hunt, Jack Pous.
- **III. MINUTES:** Secretary John Donovan made a motion, seconded by Director Ed Henderson, to approve the draft November 9, 2020 minutes (passed 31-0).
- IV. TREASURER'S REPORT: Presented by President David Sherry on behalf of Treasurer Jim Simpson (See Attachment 1). A motion to approve the November 2020 Treasurer's report and to pay reimbursements was made by Secretary John Donovan, seconded by Vice President Rick Deckert (passed 31-0).

V. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Standing Committees

Architectural Report: President David Sherry stated the ARC report is in the OIL Lantern.

VI. UNFINISHED AND NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Jackson Bain made a motion, seconded by Director Brick Bradford, to establish an ad hoc committee composed of Secretary John Donovan, Director Jesse Hunt, Don Didier, Dylan Hunt, and Lisa Johnson, to investigate future OILA online record storage options, limiting the scope to key documents and key emails generated going forward, including who will do the work, what is the cost, and what technology platform(s) can be used. The ad hoc committee will report to the OILA board and membership by the February 8 meeting. The motion passed 22-8 (Louis Belanger, Dawn Boggess, Jerry Boggess, Mel Mattison, Steven Niven, Glenn and Mary Scheuermann, David Sherry, and Tom Wilson opposed).
- 2. President David Sherry led a brief discussion of the survey results published in the December OIL Lantern ranking member priorities. He reported the results:
 - 1. Get East Pass Sand for Okaloosa Island 186 points
 - 2. Preserve Okaloosa Island Dunes 130 points
 - 3. Get better sand source for Okaloosa Island if it ever needs beach restoration 120 points
 - 4. Improve storm drainage 70 points
 - 5. Hold off doing anything to Santa Rosa Blvd until new bridge finalized 53 points
 - 6. TIE Coastal or offshore structures to preserve Okaloosa Island beach 51 points
 - 7. TIE Move power lines underground for faster hurricane recovery 51 points David said one of the members put it concisely, a lot of things are nice things to have; we need a good beach and storm protection.

VII. ANNOUNCEMENTS:

 Jennifer Fox expressed an interest in an additional traffic light in front of the Seaspray complex on US Hwy 98, and offered to lead a membership effort if there is interest. President David Sherry offered to give her county contacts in that area of responsibility.

VIII. ADJOURNMENT: The meeting was adjourned at **8:26** PM (motion by Jim Blaha, seconded by Secretary John Donovan and passed 23-0).

January 3, 1920 - Boston Red Sox baseball club owner Harry Frazee announces agreement to sell slugger **Babe Ruth** to the New York Yankees for \$125,000 in cash and a \$350,000 loan; start of the 84 year "Curse of the Bambino"



January 8, 1987 - The Dow Jones industrial average first topped the 2,000 mark

January 8, 1955 - Georgia Tech ends Kentucky's 130-game home basketball win streak

January 14, 1942 - Camp Hood was activated. The temporary camp, named for Confederate general John Bell Hood, is now one of the largest military installations in the world. By 1950 it was made a permanent army post and renamed Fort Hood. Units from Hood have contributed significantly to all important overseas United States military actions since 1942.

January 18, 1911 – Naval Lieutenant Eugene Ely became the first man ever to land an airplane on the deck of a ship, the converted cruiser USS Pennsylvania, in San Francisco Bay.
