




#### OKALOOSA ISLAND LEASEHOLDERS ASSOCIATION

### A CIVIL WAR VETERAN WAS WOUNDED BETWEEN THE EYES WITH A MUSKET BALL SURVIVED AND LIVED TO AGE 88



There are many incredible war stories of survival that defy all logic or explanation. Jacob Miller's survival was nothing short of miraculous. Miller, a native of Logansport, served in Company K of the 9th Indiana Infantry during the Civil War. In one of his numerous battles, Miller was struck squarely in the forehead with a bullet, which tore a jagged hole and entered his brain, allowing doctors to view the pulsations of his brain. The wound never healed. Jacob Miller died Jan. 13, 1917 at the age of 88.


Please read and follow the instructions for submission of an OILA ARC application:

- 1.1. Completed OILA ARC application,
- 1.2. Survey plat of the property,
- 1.3. Overlaid illustration of the project on a copy of the survey plat.
- 1.4. Other supporting documents\* (drawings, plans, specifications, etc.) (\*If these are large files, they can be submitted separately).
- 1.5. (Combine the files into one file for submission to the ARC, either in MS Word or Adobe PDF format.)
- 2. Email the completed ARC application file to the OILA ARC for review at OILAARC@yahoo.com.

The ARC applications will be reviewed in the order they are received and the review will be completed within 2 weeks of a completed application. (Note: The ARC no longer holds meetings in-person/zoom meetings the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday's of the month)

# THIS MONTH IN HISTORY – FEBRUARY

**February 4, 1941** — Roy Plunkett received a patent in for "tetrafluoroethylene polymers," better known as TEFLON.

**February 6, 1917** — Sunmaid raisins were trademark registered.

**February 8, 1587** – Mary Stuart, Queen of Scots was beheaded at Fotheringham, England after 19 years as a prisoner of Queen Elizabeth I.

**February 11, 1847** - American inventor Thomas Edison (1847-1931) was born in Milan, Ohio.

February 12, 1924 - First presidential radio address: Calvin Coolidge

**February 14, 1929** - The St. Valentine's Day massacre occurred in Chicago as seven members of the Bugs Moran gang were gunned down by five of Al Capone's mobsters posing as police

**February 15, 1898** - In Havana, the U.S. Battleship Maine was blown up while at anchor and quickly sank with 260 crew members lost. The incident inflamed public opinion in the U.S., resulting in a declaration of war against Spain on April 25, 1898, amid cries of "Remember the Maine!"

February 23, 1896 - The Tootsie Roll goes on sale in America.

**February 24, 1857** — The first perforated United States postage stamps were delivered to the government.

**February 27, 1950** – The 22nd Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, limiting the president to two terms or a maximum of ten years in office.

# State Road 285 to close for missions next week

EGLIN AIR FORCE BASE, Fla. -- The 96th Test Wing will conduct testing on the Eglin range complex requiring the closure of State Road 285.

Testing will take place from Feb. 7-10, 2023. The road will be closed between the scheduled times on the following dates:

- Feb. 7 between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m.
- $_{\odot}$  Feb. 8 between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m.
- Feb. 9 between 10 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.
- $_{\odot}$  Feb. 10 between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m.

The road will not be closed for more than a 90-minute period. Note, the road may be closed for several periods within the time frame.
