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REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT - Ed Henderson

Happy March to All!

It appears we made it through a cold winter and are enjoying the start of a beautiful spring.

I am most excited to announce that our guest speaker for our March 13 meeting will be Congressman Matt Gaetz and to accommodate the increased audience we have moved the meeting to The Breakers of Fort Walton Beach, 381 Santa Rosa Blvd, Fort Walton Beach, FL 32548. (Special thanks to Dave and Rebecca Sherry for obtaining this accommodation at no cost to OILA).

Congressman Gaetz has been asked to give an overview of the national scene and will take questions.

The County Commission has been extremely active passing legislative issues that the majority of Okaloosa Island residents do not want such as the reduction of the last mile of Santa Rosa Blvd to two lanes. The BCC stated it is necessary to do so for the storm water drainage and the sidewalk wide enough to land a small aircraft.

It is strongly felt by those opposed both can be accomplished without lane reductions. It was still passed unanimously however funding has not been obtained.

On February 21 the BCC unanimously voted to take control of our beaches and resorted to, in my opinion, a most unfair taxation of the condo owners who already are paying more than their fair share via real estate taxes and supporting Tourism Tax collections. Those who supported this Beach bill need to prepare for what I think is next for The BCC; the pavement of our Beach Freeways for increased parking. I also feel this move will open our Island to increased commercial venues as developers will have better access for potential new hotels and condominiums in Section B 1. I hope I am wrong.

Well off of the soap box for now; with the anticipated increased attendance and our having to put out chairs before the meeting and return them volunteers are appreciated to set up and take down our seating.

I look forward to seeing you March 13 at The Breakers.







AMERICA'S MILITARY STONEHENGE - ANTHEM VETERANS MEMORIAL - ANTHEM, ARIZONA



At precisely 11:11 A.M. MST each Veterans Day, the sun shines through a veterans memorial in Anthem, Arizona. The monument is dedicated to those who have and continue to serve in the United States











The memorial was designed by Anthem resident Renee Palmer-Jones. It features five marble pillars to represent the original five branches of the military, ordered in accordance with the <u>Department of Defense</u>'s prescribed precedence: the <u>US Army</u>, the <u>US Marine Corps</u>, the <u>US Navy</u>, the <u>US Air Force</u> and the <u>US Coast Guard</u>. The <u>US Space Force</u> was not yet in existence at the time of the memorial's construction. The pillars are staggered in size, from 17 feet to 6 feet, and have a circle cut out of their center. This ensures that when the sun shines through them on <u>Veterans Day</u> that a solar spotlight appears over a mosaic of The Great Seal of the United States on the ground. Anthem resident and chief engineer, Jim Martin, was charged with ensuring the pillars aligned accurately with the sun. He <u>shared</u> that this was done with a "fixed azimuth (the horizontal angle from astronomical north to the center of the sun that creates the horizontal illumination of the Great Seal)" and a "fixed altitude angle (the vertical angle for zenith, or horizon, to the center of the sun that creates the vertical illumination of the Great Seal)."

LATEST UPDATES ON LOCAL PROJECTS

Brooks Bridge: Construction has begun on the initial phase, which is underground work for utilities. The cost to the State of Florida is estimated to be \$170 million dollars. The north side (Marler Park side) will be built first, and the old bridge will continue in use until the new side is constructed. Estimated completion date is 2027.

Bridge to Bridge! Working with the Federal government, Okaloosa County is in the final stages of designing the Bridge to Bridge Trail Project. It is hoped this phase will be completed within the next 3 to 6 months, with construction beginning in the fall of 2023. It's a \$6 million project that will provide a much-needed corridor for walking, running and biking in our beautiful area.

Around the Mound: On Tuesday, February 28, 2023, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) announced the kickoff of the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) study for the "Around the Mound" project in Downtown Fort Walton Beach. The proposed conceptual improvements include State Road 30 (U.S. 98) from S.R. 189 (Beal Parkway) to the west end of Brooks Bridge and north along S.R. 85 to south of Hollywood Boulevard. The "Around the Mound" project aims to improve safety and reduce congestion in the area by creating a bypass around the downtown area, while enhancing the overall aesthetic of the downtown area. The project involves the construction of a new roadway and the installation of new infrastructure, such as traffic signals and pedestrian crossings. The PD&E study will provide a critical step in the process of re-routing Highway 98 around the Indian Temple Mound museum in Downtown Fort Walton Beach.

Smoking or Vaping on County Beach/Park Properties – The Okaloosa County Commission passed an ordinance banning vaping and smoking on County Beaches and at County parks. New signage with detailed information is forthcoming.

Okaloosa Island: The redesign of Santa Rosa Boulevard is underway.
