STATUS UPDATE ON THE PROPOSED BIKE PATHWAYS ON SANTA ROSA BLVD & OKALOOSA ISLAND – by Dave Hancock

Since we started discussing the possibilities of bike pathways on Santa Rosa Boulevard and Okaloosa Island a lot of progress has been made. Right now we are waiting on the ORAC grant program to be ready for applications. ORAC showed their system for the first time to the Okaloosa County Commissioners at their 1/22 meeting; thankfully they made no changes so the grant system should be up and running in March. Here is our strategy for applying for grants:

- In March apply for a \$90k grant to do a preliminary design and environmental studies of the proposed pathways on both Okaloosa Island and Santa Rosa Boulevard. The break point in grants is \$90k below that it's only a 4 page form and relatively easy to get and the money is already in the county's hands.
- When BP provides additional POT 1 funds, which is coming thanks to the courts, we will have completed
 environmentals in had and also verified that the design is feasible so it will be more likely to succeed than other
 competing proposals.
- Between getting the first grant and applying for the second we can get information together for the next application. That will need economic impact information, public support, buy in from the affected parties, etc. and will take some time to do.
- Remember ORAC is not the decision maker on the grants they make recommendations to and do rankings for the county commission. That's why now is the time to socialize this with the county commissioners.

So far we have four Okaloosa commissioners on board.

Last week the Okaloosa County Commission met; the good news for the Bike Pathway Preliminary Design Study is that of the \$6 million dollars in the county's hands \$1 million has been reserved for the \$90k studies. That's great news as Okaloosa County has millions in drainage needs.

Cannot go any further without mentioning the assistance of Brian Ruscher of the Florida DEP. DEP has responsibility for pathways and greenways; Brian cover the north half of Florida. No one knew when we started investigating bike pathways that DEP has in the works a Great Florida Northwest Florida Transportation Corridor (see below). So our pathway initiative will be part of that. Also must mention the support by Jim Trifilio of the TDC; without his help we would have never got off the ground.

Between now and March we are getting support assembled by socializing the pathway proposal with all the key players and getting statements of support. Brian offered to generate a letter of support from DEP for the grant application and Jim suggested and I agreed to make a short presentation to the TDC at their next meeting 2/26 to get support from them. The idea is that the more endorsements we get from local governments and stakeholders the better. Have set up one for 2/11 to brief Fort Walton Beach officials and hopefully get something in writing. Have give credit to Brian for the great information available on the DEP website – every time an official sees that map with the Great Northwest Florida Transportation Corridor their eyes light up. Kathy Foster will meet with Kelly Windes, the only Okaloosa Commissioner we have not briefed; Jill Higgins is coordinating with the FWB chamber of commerce.

Did not know this but Nathan Bolyes, an Okaloosa County Commissioner who I sat down with last week, also sits on the West Florida Regional Planning Council. They may to be able to provide assistance; they also have an individual – Jenny Cook – see below who is responsible for things like bike pathways. They may be able to help with the environmental studies. Will follow up with her.

Nathan Boyles repeated something that Jim Trifilio and I discussed briefly last Tuesday .**Sustainable Tourism.** Per Nathan this will get people out of their cars and on bikes so it should be classified as sustainable. Here's a great idea – we slogan our initiative around sustainable tourism.

Want to point out that so far EVERYONE we have talked to about this – Okaloosa County Commissioners, Eglin, FWS, DEP, FDOT, etc. – is in favor of the bike pathways proposal. Of course there are two caveats – we have to het funding via grants and final buy in by the stakeholders will require the completed environmental studies.
