# Okaloosa County News Release – May 24, 2016

Okaloosa County Preliminary Flood Information Available Through NWF Water Management District

Editor's Note: The effective Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) for Okaloosa County was issued December 6, 2002. The preliminary FIRM for Okaloosa County was issued April 29, 2016 and is under review – see below two Open House meetings. Considering that flood insurance rates are based on the effective FIRM map, it is recommended that property owners utilize the below portal to compare their flood rating with the effective map and the preliminary map.

The public will have two opportunities to review Okaloosa County flood maps updated by FEMA and The Northwest Florida Water Management District (NWFWMD). Open House meetings are scheduled are as follows:

• June 28, 2016, from 4 until 7 PM: Okaloosa County Commission meeting room at 1250 Eglin Parkway, Shalimar

• June 29, 2016, 4 until 7 PM: City of Crestview Warrior Hall, 201 Stillwell Boulevard in Crestview

Citizens are encouraged to view the maps online and/or at the Open House. The NWFMD has created a "portal" to access flood information and resources at the following link: <u>http://portal.nwfwmdfloodmaps.com/</u>. Select the county and type in your address to get flood information.



# **THE 9/11 MEMORIAL FLAG** WILL BE ON DISPLAY AT THE DESTIN-FORT WALTON **BEACH AIRPORT UNTIL SEPT 10, 2016**



The 9/11 Memorial Flag is currently on display at the Destin-Fort Walton Beach Airport. It will be available for viewing and photographs until September 10, 2016. On September 11, 2016 it will become an exhibit at the New York 9-11 Museum.

The Flag is 32 feet wide and 22 feet long. The flag is a quilt of numerous small American Flags sewn together by Americans. The star field (or canton) consists of 4 large American Flags. It also includes flags from the countries who lost citizens in the attack.

The flag, which arrived at the airport on May 16, 2016 is open for viewing by the public. If you wish to view the flag drive to the Airport short term parking lot. The Airport is providing free parking for those who wish to see this display. A ticket must be collected while entering the lot but will be validated when you leave.

# MEMORIAL DAY HAPPENING: MANATEE "AGGREGATION" SPOTTED ON OKALOOSA ISLAND – Jim Simpson



On Monday, August 30 (Memorial Day) DeeAnn White and her son (recent high school graduate) Dee White were visiting the home of OILA members Dee and Ginger Hawk (625 Pelican Drive) when they spotted 7 manatees feeding on the grass adjacent to their Sound Side boat dock. Dee White took the photo to the right and also video taped the manatees. If you would like to see the video, please contact me and I will send it to you. I have lived on the Sound Side for 18 years and have never seen even one manatee.

Manatees are not territorial animals. Because they have evolved with few natural enemies, they have not needed the protection or cooperation of a herd. Consequently, they are semi-social, somewhat solitary animals. They sometimes gather in small, informal groups, but they have no leader or real herd structure. Manatee gatherings, called **"aggregations,"** are largely due to common habitat requirements such as warm water, fresh water, or food sources.

During breeding, a single female, or cow, will be followed by a group of a dozen or more males, or bulls, forming what is known as a "**mating herd.**" The term "**herd**" is also a fairly typical way to refer to a group of manatees

As your County Commissioner it is my privilege to serve as the Liaison to the Destin-Ft. Walton Beach Airport. We have enjoyed a year of unprecedented growth in 2016 under the leadership of Airports Director Tracy Stage and his team. Due to his vision and leadership we have two new airlines and a third to start soon! We now travel to fourteen cities in 2016. Last week, we celebrated five full inaugural flights on **Allegiant** with the sixth from St. Louis/Bellville scheduled this Thursday. The local economic impacts of these new carriers equates to an additional \$14M in tourist spending in the first season alone.

**Delta** remains our largest carrier with seven non-stops to Atlanta (ATL) per day. **American** has five non-stops to Dallas-Fort Worth (DFW) per day and 4 non-stops to Charlotte per day, and **Washington DC (DCA)** service is back with one flight on Saturdays and Sundays! **United** has three non-stops to Houston (HOU) 3 times per day. **Contour Airlines** is due to start service in August from Bowling Green, Kentucky, two times per week.
