MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT - David Hancock

Last year was a great year for OILA. We had several successes which will improve the life of Okaloosa Island owners and make the island a more attractive destination for visitors. I hope we can all pull together to make the next year just as successful.

First I want to ask a favor from all OILA members – if anyone has any ideas that will improve the island for owners and visitors or knows of any problems OILA needs to address please let us know. Send to me or any board member. Nobody has a monopoly on ideas or knowledge; please share what you thinking.

Here is a brief list of in progress projects and problems that need to be addressed:

- The Bridge to Bridge Pathway is on track. Final approval for the design and environmental study phase funds will happen **Sept 19**. Then the up front work required by the Air Force can begin. And then OILA can begin work on future grants to fund the Bridge to Bridge Pathway construction. That's when our real work starts.
- The Beach Access way improvements are in limbo. Funds were allocated by Okaloosa County, but as federal construction guidelines for beach permanent structures have been upgraded the cost is too high. There may be a way to move forward however. Instead of using a permanent structure for bathroom facilities use portable structures. Here are a couple of types for consideration.





- OILA took an early stand adamantly opposing the Wright Pkwy Alternate crossing option. And OILA established strong links with FDOT, local, and state government to cement this opposition.
- Aquagreen, who has the lease on the property for the proposed fish hatchery on Okaloosa Island will no longer pursue that activity. What Aquagreen wants is to change the terms of their lease so instead of being a non profit fish hatchery they will operate a for profit amusement park. I hope all OILA members will join me in opposing this change. This property was never intended to be a for profit entity. This issue will be considered at the September Okaloosa County Commissioner meeting on Tuesday, September 20.

In closing I want to thank OILA members for honoring me as president. Will do my upmost to do this. And again I ask for the enthusiastic and positive support of OILA members.


Editor's Note – Current Information: In May 2016 the Air Force sent a letter to the FDOT advising them that the Air Force will not support the alternate routes at Wright Parkway (Alternative 1), Hollywood Blvd (Alternatives 5, 6 7 & 8) and Yacht Club Drive (Alternative 9). The letter stated: ... "The position of the Air Force ruling out these six alternatives is based on the fact that these routes would impact Air Force property"... and concluded ... "We do not support the inclusion of these routes on the list of alternatives moving forward for further consideration"... The Air Force does not object to the alternatives in the immediate vicinity of the existing bridge. In a May 4, 2016 article in the Northwest Florida Daily News, State Sen. Don Gaetz, R-Niceville, is quoted as saying: "The Air Force decision to oppose the selected alternates — enumerated in a power point presentation as one, five, six, seven, eight and nine — should put an end to discussions of a Wright Parkway bridge" and added the following: ... "Hopefully this ends that discussion and will focus FDOT's efforts on replacing the Brooks Bridge at the location where it exists now"...

Details

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), has scheduled a public meeting to discuss the Santa Rosa Sound Alternate Crossing Study in Okaloosa County. The meeting will be held in an open-house format **Tuesday, September 20**, from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. Central Daylight Time (CDT) at the Emerald Coast Convention Center, 1250 Miracle Strip Parkway, S.E., Fort Walton Beach, Florida.

The meeting is being held to present progress to date and obtain comments on the corridor alternatives under evaluation. The meeting will be held in an open-house format and will include a presentation video. Maps, graphics, and other project information will be on display for review. FDOT representatives will be available to discuss the project and answer questions.

What is the purpose of the study?

The Santa Rosa Sound Alternate Crossing Study is a high-level planning study that focuses on the feasibility for an alternate road and bridge corridor between Fort Walton Beach and Okaloosa Island. At the conclusion of the study, FDOT will make a decision whether to proceed to the next phase, a Project Development and Environment (PD&E) study, for this project.

Why is the project needed?

An alternate corridor is being considered as a means to relieve traffic congestion along U.S. 98 in downtown Fort Walton Beach.

During a medical emergency Paramedics can provide advanced life support care including: advanced airway management, endotracheal intubation (breathing tube), manual defibrillation, external transcutaneous pacing, EKG monitoring, 12-lead EKG acquisition, IV fluid therapy, intraosseus infusions, hemodynamic monitoring, needle chest decompressions, surgical airways, administration of a wide array of critical care medications and mechanical ventilation.

As many of you know, there is an Emergency Use traffic light located in front of the James F. Hooks Public Safety Center on Okaloosa Island. (Photo on the left) During normal use, this light flashes a yellow caution to Santa Rosa Blvd traffic, in a similar manner as a school zone. During times of emergency vehicle traffic, the light is designed to turn red for the Santa Rosa Blvd traffic and green for the emergency vehicles accessing Santa Rosa. Blvd.

Once the emergency vehicles have passed, the light returns to a flashing yellow caution.

It is not uncommon for vacationers to not see the light or for residents to forget the light is there because most of the time it is flashing yellow and, therefore, not given a second thought. However many of us have had that "moment of surprise" when the emergency vehicles leave the station. The proper action to take in this area is to SLOW DOWN because the light IS flashing yellow and be aware the emergency vehicles that may be called out at any time. DO NOT rely on the light to turn red. There have been times when the light did not turn red as it was designed. This may have caused some confusion. However,

unless it is red, it always flashes yellow as a reminder to drivers that this is always a caution area.
