LATEST NEWS ON THE BRIDGE TO BRIDGE PATHWAY FROM THE DIRECTOR, OKALOOSA COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS - Funding for this project was approved as part of the FY17 budget. Funding is identified within the TDD budget in the amount of \$102,000 for preliminary survey and preliminary design to establish the feasibility of the project. 

A BRIEF UPDATE AS OF OCT 11 OF THE 2016 SANTA ROSA SOUND ALTERNATE CROSSING STUDY - submitted by Kathy Foster

While 'no build' remains an option, the Stakeholder Advisory Group narrowed recommendations to **Alternative 7** (Hollywood Boulevard to the island) as a long term solution and **Alternative 10** (Mary Esther Hollywood connecting with Brooks Bridge) as a short term solution. It was determined that these two paths were the most feasible sites for study and possible implementation.






Also, a tip of the hat to our excellent Okaloosa Island Firefighters for taking the time to educate and entertain these children!







