MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT – David Hancock

Our Decorations on Santa Rosa Boulevard and the Island are Fantastic. Have asked everyone I know how they like them and it's been 100% positive response. THANKS to all the individuals who have helped to make this happen.

The Christmas Caroling Event on December 16 is on track to be a fantastic event. The Okaloosa Fire Station has graciously offered to let us use their station as a base: Okaloosa Transit is sending two trolleys; some St. Simons choir members will be there to add their voices. Please plan to attend establish a new Okaloosa island tradition.

And here is the breaking news:

• NRDA grant to fund the beach access way construction on Okaloosa Island. These funds come from the Deep Water Horizon Settlement The Okaloosa Tourist Development Council has applied for a; the money is already available with the NRDA trustees in Tallahassee making the award decisions. Note that the City of Destin was just awarded \$10+ million for Noriega Point. The requirement for these grants is to not only fix damage but to also provide and enhance recreational opportunities! Darrel Rogers, Jim Trifilio, and the rest of the TDC team continue to provide us invaluable support.

• We have a decision from the National Park Service on the Bridge to Bridge to Bridge Pathway. Remember there is a section of NPS property across from the Okaloosa County Visitor Center. The Bridge to Bridge Pathway will have no effect of them so NO NPS permit is necessary.

• The Okaloosa TDC has asked OILA for a resolution supporting an Estuary Program that would work to improve the waters, habitats, living resources and economy of the Choctawhatchee Bay watershed. In Okaloosa County, water quality in the bay is a critical component of our tourism economy, as the bay is both scenic and provides recreational opportunities for visitors and locals alike. The program would eventually complete projects throughout the entire watershed, including in Holmes, Walton, and Washington Counties. Projects would include, but are not limited to: storm water improvements, restoration initiatives, and road paving. Northwest Florida State College has agreed to provide administrative support for the estuary program that would include human resources and financial services. The Okaloosa Board of County Commissioners has already passed a resolution supporting the Estuary Program.

The OILA resolution is on the agenda for the 12/12 meeting for approval by our members. If you are for clean water please vote yes!

Again please let me ask everyone to attend our Caroling Event 16 December.





A motion was made, seconded to approve the treasurer's report and to reimburse Jim Simpson a total of **\$20.68** for stamps to mail the November 2016 newsletter. The motion was approved

Committee Reports

Architectural Report: The Architectural Committee Reports for September and October were published in the November 2016 OIL Lantern.

Membership: Jim Simpson reported a total of 249 for now with a final total when the Membership Renewal Drive ends in December 2016. Current membership total – pending possible, additional December renewals is 232.

Street Lighting MSBU: Paula Hudson reported that there had been no charges (water, electricity) recorded for the month of October, but they would be picked later in the November report. For the month of October, Paula reported revenues of \$4,404.02 and billing charges of \$220.21 for a revenue balance for the month of \$4,183.21 and a total ending balance of \$244,752.59.

Webmaster: Nothing to report. Boat Basin: No report available

OLD BUSINESS: Dave Hancock reported good progress on relocating the No Wake signs in Santa Rosa Sound. The Okaloosa County BCC is supportive. He also reported that Okaloosa County Public Works is starting their environmental survey for the Bridge to Bridge Pathway project. It should take 6 months to complete. In addition, progress is being made by Okaloosa County (Public Works and the TDC) who are striving to upgrade the three, unimproved public beach accesses to the standards of the other, improved accesses. Dave noted that District 2 Okaloosa County Commissioner **Carolyn Ketchel** has been very helpful and involved on these projects. Also, the Okaloosa County BCC transferred the lease for the Fish Hatchery to Wild Willie's Adventure Zone.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Due to problems with several properties on the Island, a motion was made, seconded and approved to reconstitute the Derelict Property Committee. Dave Hannock will send a letter to John Dowd, who has done legal work for the Leaseholders in this area.

2. Susie Bayne noted that there was an increasing number of dogs on Okaloosa Island beach. Dave Hannock advised that he would talk with the Sheriff's Office about enforcing the "No Dogs on the Beach" ordinance and check to see if any of the contract beach services could assist in reporting violations.

3. Questions arose about the legality of operating golf carts on the streets of Okaloosa Island. It was agreed that at the December meeting information from the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office about this subject will be presented.

MEETING ADJOURNED at 8 pm. (Editor's note: These minutes extracted from the November 14 podcast of this meeting)
