

DURING THIS MONTH IN HISTORY - NOVEMBER



November 6, 1860 - Abraham Lincoln was elected as the 16th U.S. President and the first Republican. He received 180 of 303 possible electoral votes and 40 percent of the popular vote.

November 14, 1666 - The first experimental blood transfusion took place in Britain, utilizing two dogs.

November 17, 1800 - The U.S. Congress met for the first time in the new capital at Washington, D.C. President John Adams then became the first occupant of the Executive Mansion, later renamed the White House.

November 24, 1835 - Texas lawmakers instituted a special force known as the **Texas Rangers**. Stephen F. Austin had hired ten experienced frontiersmen as "rangers" as early as 1823, but the 1835 legislation formalized the organization.



November 28, 1934 - FBI agents killed bank robber George "Baby Face" Nelson near Barrington, Illinois.

OKALOOSA ISLAND FIRE DEPARTMENT PURCHASES RESCUE DESCENT DEVICES WITH FUNDS FROM A PIGT GRANT



Firefighter Utilizing the Rescue Descent Device

Recently, he Okaloosa Island Fire District was the recipient of a \$5,000 grant for fireighter safety from PGIT, the workers compensation insurance carrier for the department. Utlizing \$3,200 of this grant allowed us to purchase 15 (one for each active firefighter) much needed self rescue descent devices (see photo) along with 50 ft of fire rated rescue rope. These rope rescue systems allow the members of the Okaloosa Island Fire District to self rescue if caught in a bad situation while on an elevated platform fighting fire. The rope rescue system comes with a hook, a descent device and 50ft of fire rated rope (rated for 900 degrees). These roperescue systems hook to harnesses that are integrated into our bunker pants. It is easily accessible and easy to use. This grant greatly enhances the safety of all members of OIFD.

Remember, each donation can save kup to tghree lives so that means 51 patients could benefits from the lifesaving efforts of blood donors at Okaloosa Island Fire Department back on **Feb 16**th, **2017.**

The blood donated at your blood drive will likely be transfused into a patient with 48 to 72 hours. The turnaround is that fast and is that constant.

Ronald Reagan National Airport. The first flight will take off from Destin-Fort Walton Beach Airport at 11:00 am, Friday, May 4 arriving at Reagan National Airport at 2:19 pm. On the same day, a fllight will depart Washington D.C. at 8:45 am arriving at Destin-Fort Walton Beach Airport at 10:07 am. These two flight schedules will run daily.

In addition to making it easier for all to transverse back and forth (e.g. tourists, family, friends), this is great news for local federal government employees and members of the military community who quite frequentally need to communite back and forth. Eliminating a lay-over is a great improvement. The route will be flown utilizing American's newest aircraft, the 76-seat EMB-175 (photo above).

ISLAND LIGHTS MSBU - Paula Hudson: No report – Okaloosa County was in the process of during the fiscal year ending report on the MSBU and a report was not available.

VII. OLD BUSINESS:

- A. Bridge to Bridge Hike/Bike Path: Dave Hancock reported that steps needed to be taken to perserve green areas in front of business front Hwy 98 for the path as it comes off Brooks Bridge.
- B. Santa Rosa Sound Minimum Wake Expansion: Tripp Tolbert advised that the need for expanding the minimum wake zone had been brought to the attention of our Florida State Senator, Mel Ponder.

VII. NEW BUSINESS:
