MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT – David Sherry

This month's OILA meeting, February 10 at 7:00 PM, will feature Crime Prevention Specialist Ashley Bailey and Captain Charlie Nix, both with the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office (OCSO), as our guest speakers. They will address crime and vagrancy on Okaloosa Island, include suggestions



on what you can do to be safe, how and when to report incidents and concerns to OCSO, and then take audience questions. As a courtesy to our speakers and audience, it is my intention to let them speak at the beginning of the meeting.

On January 21 the Okaloosa County Commissioners (BCC) held two public hearings.

One public hearing considered revisions to the beach vendor ordinance which regulates activity on the beaches of Okaloosa Island, and placement of personal property on the beach. After much discussion and public input, the BCC voted to ban vending on the spoils islands in Santa Rosa Sound, and did not revise the beach vending portion of the ordinance. Staff had not collected beach usage data last summer as requested by Commissioners, and the BCC was concerned the lack of data could lead them to make poor choices. The BCC also discussed changes to better address public use of the beach. County staff will bring a data collection plan and a revised beach vendor fee schedule to the BCC in February.

The other public hearing considered an ordinance to regulate short-term rentals of single family homes. This item was tabled until the BCC meeting on July 21, 2020, after the close of this year's Florida legislative session. The Legislature is considering bills that could preempt the new county ordinance, while older ordinances and restrictions may remain grandfathered.

At the same BCC meeting Commissioner Boyles expressed an interest in having Okaloosa County examine the Okaloosa Island Protective Covenants and Restrictions (Covenants), with an eye toward attempting to change them. Given the Florida Legislature's prior preemption, changing the Covenants could make its prohibition of short-term rentals in the B-1 areas of Okaloosa Island null and void. Additionally, in Commissioner Boyles' January newsletter he expressed an interest in improving all the soundside (north) accessways on Okaloosa Island.

February was added to the Roman calendar in 713 BC. The length of the month changed over



DRAFT MINUTES - OKALOOSA ISLAND LEASEHOLDERS ASSOCIATION - JANUARY 13, 2020

CALL TO ORDER: Meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by **President David Sherry**.

- I. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Pledge of Allegiance led by Lew Paul.
- II. ROLL: Board Members Present: David Sherry (President), John Donovan (Secretary), Jim Simpson (Treasurer), Brick Bradford, Kathy Foster, Dr. David Miller.
- **III. MINUTES:** Secretary John Donovan made a motion, seconded by Carmen Parker, to approve the draft December 9, 2019 minutes. Motion was approved.
- **IV. TREASURER'S REPORT:** Presented by Treasurer Jim Simpson (See Attachment 1). Jim Simpson reported a membership of 249 members. A motion to approve the Treasurer's report and to reimburse Jim Simpson was made by Director Kathy Foster, seconded by Michelle Seitz, with an accepted amendment by President David Sherry to include Christmas decoration reimbursements in addition to the reimbursements to Treasurer Jim Simpson. Motion was approved.

Architectural Report: No report other than as set forth in the OIL Lantern.

VI. UNFINISHED AND NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Director Kathy Foster gave an update on planned Okaloosa County projects on Okaloosa Island. Reroofing of the Beach Access #7 pavilion begins this month. Crosswalks with flashing lights will be completed in early 2020 using sales tax surcharge funds. Okaloosa County has obtained a grant to construct a sidewalk on the south side of Santa Rosa Boulevard. Sales tax surcharge funds could be used to supplement the grant. Property owner input will be requested at a public meeting likely to be held this March.
- 2. Director David Miller reported on continued lack of maintenance and unclean conditions at Okaloosa Island's southside beach access facilities.

- 3. President David Sherry reported he had followed up with Jason Autrey, Director, Okaloosa County Public Works, regarding survey activity at the Third Beach Freeway, and was told no construction is planned.
- 4. Everyone who made the Christmas season activities a success was thanked: Nancy Hunt, Christmas decorating committee chairman, Bob and Michelle Seitz who dropped off a record OILA donation of dry goods at Sharing and Caring, Paul Barcus of Wild Willy's who provides storage for OILA's Christmas decorations, the volunteers who put up OILA's Christmas decorations, and the leaseholders who decorated their own property.

VII. ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- 1. President David Sherry reminded those present that two Okaloosa County public hearings are scheduled for 2 PM January 21 at the County Administration building in Shalimar (during the County Commission meeting that begins at 1:30 PM). One public hearing will be to adopt changes to the beach vendor ordinance regulating activity on the beaches of Okaloosa Island, and placement of personal property on the beach. The other public hearing will be to adopt a new single family home short-term rental ordinance. Per the November 12 public workshop draft minutes the new short-term rental ordinance will not supersede restrictions contained in the Okaloosa Island Protective Covenants. Since anything can happen at a public hearing, he encouraged those present to attend the hearings or to contact the County Commissioners if these issues are important to them. Treasurer Jim Simpson asked if President Sherry would like an e-mail blast to be sent on this issue to the members, and David said yes.
- 2. President Sherry announced the February 10 OILA meeting will feature Ashley Bailey, Crime Prevention Specialist, and Sergeant Brian Perkins, both of the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Department. They will address crime and vagrancy on Okaloosa Island, and will include suggestions on what you can do to be safe and how and when to report incidents and concerns to the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office.

VIII. ADJOURNMENT: The meeting was adjourned at 7:32 PM (motion by Carmen Parker, seconded by John Donovan and passed).


